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Jiménez Barbero, Jose Antonio... et al. Effectiveness of antibullying school programmes: A systematic review by evidence levels.

This study seeks to examine the efficiency of programmes aimed at preventing or reducing violence in Primary and Secondary schools (population between 6–16 years of both sexes). The methodology used is the systematic search of electronic databases for studies published after January, 2000, on the assessment of the effectiveness of school interventions to prevent or reduce violence and bullying. The review finds evidence of the efficiency of the programmes assessed, although serious limitations are also detected, which should be taken into consideration when designing future interventions. Finally, the findings indicate the need for continuity in the programmes if their long-term efficiency is to be guaranteed.

Moreno, Almudena. The transition to adulthood in Spain in a comparative perspective: The incidence of structural factors.

This article sets out to describe and comparatively identify the possible factors that take part in the process of transition to adulthood, with particular emphasis on factors that explain why young people in Spain leave the parental home late in life. The results obtained suggest that in the welfare regimes of Southern Europe, and particularly in Spain, factors such as scarce emancipation policies, the cross-generational solidarity, the home-ownership culture, etc. have all created a culture of parental dependence as a strategy for accumulating capital and for coping with risks in a precarious environment.

Beltrán Carrillo, Vicente J... et al. When physical activity participation promotes inactivity: negative experiences of Spanish adolescents in physical education and sport.

This article analyses negative experiences in physical education and sport reported during qualitative interviews of a group of inactive adolescent Spanish boys and girls. The purpose of this analysis is twofold. First, it seeks to give voice to these young people reporting negative experiences and connect them to contexts of physical activity and sport in which they occurred. Second, the authors attempt to connect inactivity through negative experiences. The authors conclude by commenting on how these insights may be useful to critically reflect on physical activity programs, which are too often considered an unquestionable activity for all pupils who experience them.
