Trans\* are people who steer away from the gender with which they were born; they are a heterogeneous reality who find it challenging to express their identity in various work, school and family contexts. A study based on interviews conducted with young people explains that they are struggling in hostile environments and against transphobia and that, in many cases, this can lead to dropping out from school, a lack of self-esteem and difficulties at work. These difficult situations can be reversed through the support of teachers, adults who accept them, other trans\*... Social support is sometimes found outside the family circle, in trans\* organisations and on social networks, but there is a lack of specific programmes.

A Czech computer organisation and an NGO designed an experiment in a hotel in Ostrava to examine the vulnerability of young people on Facebook, as potential victims of crimes. The goal was to test how easy it was to access the belonging to minors (telephone, address...), partly because they publish this information without considering the risks involved, and to raise awareness. Crime prevention researchers from various countries, including Mossos d'Esquadra, took part in the experiment together with a group of students from the city. The participants created false Facebook profiles and events to attract attention. Many people responded to the contacts and the minors became aware of the risks of publishing their data and interacting with people they did not know

Young people with low academic qualifications have difficulties in finding jobs due to their limited employability. They are vulnerable and possible victims of exclusion due to their characteristics (failure, negative self-esteem, immaturity...). They have not achieved the levels required in their secondary studies (ESO) and they cannot access official vocational training. PCIP are Initial Professional Qualification Programmes that have been designed for this group. They are a bridge between education and work for young people aged 16 to 21 who want to obtain professional skills. They consist in obligatory modules (specific for professional training and generally educational) and voluntary modules to attain the obligatory secondary school qualifications (GESO). The training is designed to foster their adaptation to any circumstances that may occur in a working environment, to learn skills, obtain diplomas and enjoy the possibility of returning to the school system.

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
