

## 25 November, International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women


### In 2018, 1278 women aged 15 to 29 reported cases of gender violence in the Basque Country, according to data from the Department of Security

On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women on 25 November, the Basque Youth Observatory will be publishing data provided by Emakunde and the Department of Security of the Basque Government.

According to these data, which list the number of women and the number of cases of violence against women officially registered by the Basque police, 4244 women were victims of violence against women in the Basque Country in 2018. Of these, 1278 were women between the ages of 15 and 29.

The evolution of this register reveals that, in 2018, most of the women reporting male violence were aged 15 to 29.


Evolution of women reporting male violence, based on age group

The most frequent type of violence against women, both among the group of young women and women over the age of 30, is violence perpetrated by a partner or former partner. 908 women aged 15 to 29 reported this type of male violence in 2018. By age groups, we find that 159 women in the youngest group (15 to 19) reported this type of violence; 337 women in the 20 to 24 age group; and 412 in the 25 to 29 age group.


Evolution of women reporting violence perpetrated by their partners or former partners, based on age group (absolute figures)

In 2018, domestic violence (except violence perpetrated by partners or former partners) was reported by 184 women between the ages of 15 and 29 and by 686 people over the age of 30.


Evolution of women reporting domestic violence (except violence perpetrated by partners or former partners), based on age group (absolute figures)

Violence against women's sexual freedom is the type of violence in which the figures are closest between young women complainants and women complainants over the age of 30. In the younger group, 186 women reported episodes of violence against their sexual freedom (100 among women aged 15-19, 51 among women aged 20-24, and 35 among women aged 25-29). On the other hand, 199 women over the age of 30 reported crimes against their sexual freedom.


Evolution of women reporting crimes against their sexual freedom, based on age group (absolute figures)

The rates of female victims of gender-based violence, calculated per 1000 women in each age group, reveal significant differences between the 15-29 age group and women aged 30 or over (9.1 ‰ and 3.6 ‰ respectively). The higher rate among young women is not necessarily due to higher rates of violence against them, but because their level of tolerance is much lower, thanks to the greater empowerment of young women.

With the aim of reaching and generating processes of reflection and debate among young people, in 2009 the Beldur Barik programme was created within the network known as BERDINSAREA. Today, it is organised by Emakunde-Basque Women's Institute, with the support of Berdinsarea-Eudel and the councils of Araba, Bizkaia and Gipuzkoa. It also has the collaboration of the Department of Education of the Basque Government, the University of the Basque Country and EITB.

The Beldur Barik programme seeks to prevent gender-based violence among young people, and its goal is to promote critical thinking and discussions among young people to collaborate in transforming society and moving towards an egalitarian society. In 2019, it will celebrate its tenth anniversary by organising **Topaketa** in Bilbao, an opportunity to discover the winning projects in the competition. The goal is to bring together activities, groups, and people who are combatting gender-based violence. Furthermore, it also intends to be a space to enhance the discourses and actions used by young people to face and overcome sexist violence.
